- We have seen growth in almost all areas of our 3T testing when comparing fall 2022 literacy results to fall 2023 literacy results. Significant growth was demonstrated in all grades 1-6 classes, which experienced improvement in the targeted areas of fluency, decoding, and comprehension. In junior high, minimal decrease was seen in grade 7-9 comprehension and 7-9 fluency, with significant improvement observed in decoding. It should be noted that a change in junior high student clientele (high academic students exiting the school, new students enrolling from other schools) can be attributed to the minimal decrease seen in junior high fluency and comprehension.
- Year over year whole school literacy growth:
 - TOSREC- 2%
 - TOSWRF- 6.3%
 - TOWRE- 2%

Plan moving forward:

- BHPS staff will continue to work collaboratively to build reading skills through best practice tier one classroom programming, as well as intervention programming. Additional support will be developed through Content Coaching with BHPS teachers.

School Goal 3: Numeracy- Expansion of number sense through opportunities to develop flexible and fluent thinking.

Target and Measurement Tools:

- Numeracy growth in all BHPS students using the WRAT5 to determine growth.

- We have observed significant growth in numeracy when comparing fall 2022 numeracy results to fall 2023 numeracy results. Students in grade 2-4 received up to 3 rounds of numeracy interventions in the spring of 2023, which is likely correlated to the significant improvements in our percentage of students at or above grade level in our division 2 classes (20.2% improvement).
- Year over year whole school numeracy growth:
 - WRAT5- 9.2%

Plan moving forward:

- BHPS staff will provide explicit math instruction focused on building procedural fluency from conceptual understanding, both via tier one classroom instruction and through focused numeracy interventions in grades two to four. Additional support will be developed through Content Coaching with BHPS teachers.
