Chocolate Sales Volunteers

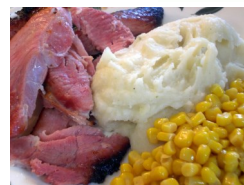

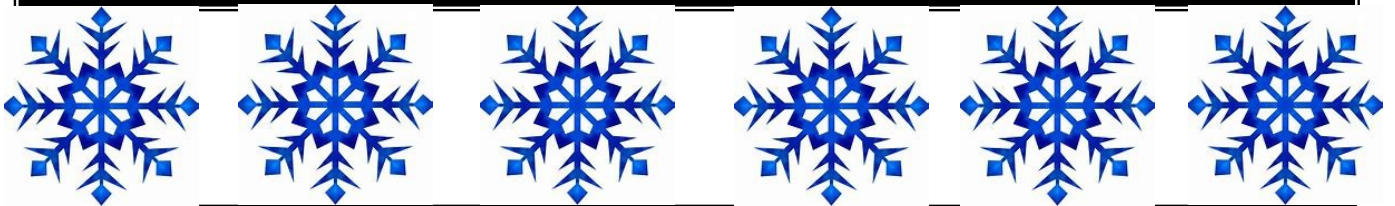
Grade 6's Raise Money for the Food Bank
