CARE Bear Assembly Tuesday, May 14 at 2:00 PM



Pre-Kindergarten (PUF) Program 2024-2025 School Year

The Fort Vermilion School Division offers a Pre-Kindergarten (PUF) Program to those children with a severe disability or moderate / severe language delay who require additional support.

The intent of the program is to provide early intervention to address the specific needs of the individual child and better prepare him/her for schooling.

- · To be eligible for the program:
- Children MUST be 3 or 4 on or before December 31, 2024 to qualify for PUF funding.
 - Students that are 5 or older on December 31, 2024 are no longer eligible for PUF funding. They will be enrolled in kindergarten classes and have their needs supported within inclusive education.
- An assessment by a qualified professional of a severe disability or moderate to severe language delay must be provided to school authorities.

SANDHILLS ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

It's not too late to register your child for Kindergarten for the 2024-2025

school year. As per Alberta Education regulations, to be eligible to register,

students **must be** five (5) years old on or before December 31st of the year of enrolment.

Parents are reminded that the following **3 pieces of information are required** for registration in Kindergarten:

- 1. Your child's Birth Certificate or Canadian Citizenship Papers,
- 2. Alberta Health Care Number, and
- Current Land Description (In town please have your house # and street/avenue ex: 10202 94 Ave; out of town - please have your legal land location ex: NW 15-105-19 and Rural 911 Address (green road sign).

Volunteers in Schools for Field Trips and Special Events

There are field trips and special events coming up in the next several weeks and these checks are required in order for you to volunteer to go on these trips.

As per Fort Vermilion School Division policy, all parents attending a school field trip, volunteering on a regular basis, or working alone with students, must provide Sandhills with a clean **Vulnerable Sector Check** and a clean **Intervention Record Check**. Volunteers are responsible for ensuring that they give a copy of these checks to each school they want to volunteer at.

If you are required to submit a new Vulnerable Sector Check or an Intervention Record Check it must be completed within the last 6 months in order to be considered valid and acceptable.

The Vulnerable Sector Check may be obtained at the Mackenzie County Office in La Crete (Monday - Friday between the hours of 8:15 - 4:00 pm). In order to obtain an Intervention Record Check you can contact High Level Children's Services by calling 780.926.4441 and they will email you a form. You can then email the form back with a scanned copy of government issued photo ID (either a drivers licence or passport).

At this point in time, we have been informed that the Intervention Check could take up to 30 days.

Second Step Spotlight Empathy - Showing Empathy



Students have learned that getting along with others helps make school a happier place. To get along with others, they need to have empathy for each other. Empathy is feeling or understanding what someone else is feeling. This week, encourage your child to be a feelings detective! They should try to notice how their friends, siblings, and/or classmates are feeling. Remind them to watch faces and bodies for clues!
