WHAT'S NEW

BUILDING FUTURES COLLEGIATE: EDGE FOR SUCCESS

Over the last year FVSD has engaged in consultations with staff, local business communities, and industry leaders to determine where gaps exist between the skills/credentials students are leaving high school with and what employers and local businesses require. Under this education model, students will have the opportunity to obtain college credits or credentials before they even leave high school, giving them a head start on achieving their goals.

Building Futures Collegiate will also connect students to local employers through internships, work experience programs and apprenticeships, opening up pathways for students to begin their careers at home.

So far, we have established partnerships with Northern Lakes College, Olds College, Lethbridge College, and SAIT.

Building Futures will operate in conjunction with existing FVSD high school buildings and utilize space in three new facilities:

• Sipiwan Center 15, 4507-45 Street, Fort Vermilion

The name refers to the deep Cree and Metis roots of many in the community (Metis District 15), and to the mighty Peace River that flows through the landscape.


• Gramson Center, 10505-96 Street, High Level Located in a prime spot within walking distance to High Level Public School, this building was named in honor of long-time resident and local businessman, Doug Gramson.

• **De Oabeit School, 9601-99 Street, La Crete** Influenced by local Mennonite culture, the name means "work" school in Low German and reflects a strong work ethic in the community and surrounding area.

DUAL CREDIT COURSES

Get a jump start on your career by enrolling in a dual credit course!

Dual credit programs provide high school students with the opportunity to begin a post-secondary course prior to graduation. Enrolled students earn both high school and college credits.

Educating our own health care workers, educators, social workers and trades people is a high priority for FVSD. Students looking to pursue university studies can also take University Transfer courses through this program.

All FVSD high school students and recent graduates who are under 20 years of age as of Sept. 1, 2024 are eligible to enroll. Contact your high school counselor or visit our website for more information.

HOMESCHOOL SUPPORT & BLENDED PROGRAMS

Receive individualized curriculum and resource support and be part of an active and engaged homeschooling community. Northern Home Education (NHEC) regularly hosts social activities and events like the Curriculum Sharing Event.

Choose from the Alberta grade level curriculum or a home education program of your choice. NHEC families have early access to funding.

Beginning May 1, parents may begin purchasing materials for the following school year, up to a maximum amount of \$901 per student, per school year. Reimbursements for homeschooling expenses happen throughout the school year with purchasing assistance available for families unable to make large purchases up front.

ESSENTIAL SERVICES

TRANSPORTATION INFORMATION

Children in Grades K-6 who live a distance greater than 1 km from their school, and students in Grades 7-12 who live a distance greater than 2 km from their school qualify to ride the bus at no charge. These students have been automatically registered to ride the bus and you will receive a phone call from your bus driver before the first day of school. Families should have received an automated text to confirm ridership and address. If you think you qualify but did not receive a text message phone Essential Services and they will confirm.

Students in grades K-6 who live within 1 km from their school and students in grades 7-12 who live within 2 km from their school do not qualify for busing and parents will have to arrange their own transportation.

Because the distance is calculated from each child's school some parents may have children who qualify for busing and children who don't qualify living in the same household.



UNSAFE DRIVING CONDITIONS

The Superintendent, in consultation with the Director of Essential Services, has authority to suspend, cancel or reroute bus service as necessary. Bus service in affected areas will be cancelled by 6:30 AM by the Director of Essential Services when the temperature reaches -40°C without the wind or -48°C with the wind as measured by Environment Canada Data. This will be posted to the schools' website and Facebook pages. In the event of a bus cancellation, drivers will inform all parents on the route as soon as possible. All students riding the bus are required to wear adequate clothing to ensure their safety during cold weather.





CROSS BOUNDARY TRANSFERS

Cross boundary transfers for children attending a school outside their attendance boundary MUST be approved by the **Director** of Essential Services, Bruce Harder.

YARD SERVICE FEES


Yard service is available for a cost of \$75 per month. In order to receive yard service, the yard MUST:

- Have a driveway wide enough to accommodate the bus
- Have an appropriate space to turn the bus around with sufficient clearance between the turn-around and any items such as vehicles, ATV's, sheds, etc.
- Have snow promptly and regularly cleared from the yard and driveway in winter
- Have a driveway and turn around area that is not excessively muddy

Yard service will be provided at no cost for:

- Families with a student that is physically disabled
- Families with a driveway in a location that does not allow for safe pick up at the road

In an effort to control costs and ride times, each yard service will be re-evaluated in the coming year. Having received yard service in the past is not a guarantee of receiving it again this year. For yard service approval, please contact Essential Services. If applicable, fees must be paid prior to commencement of yard service.
