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Volunteers in Schools Intervention Record Checks & Vulnerable Sector Checks

As per Fort Vermilion School Division policy, all parents attending a school field trip, volunteering on a regular basis, or working alone with students, must provide Sandhills with a clean **Vulnerable Sector Check** and a clean **Intervention Record Check**. Volunteers are responsible for ensuring that they give a copy of these checks to each school they want to volunteer at.

If you are required to submit a new Vulnerable Sector Check or an Intervention Record Check it must be completed within the last 6 months in order to be considered valid and acceptable.

The Vulnerable Sector Check may be obtained at the Mackenzie County Office in La Crete (Monday - Friday between the hours of 8:30 am - 4:30 pm). You will require a letter from the school to obtain this check.

Please stop by the school to pick up this letter. In order to obtain an Intervention Record Check go to https://www.fvsd.ab.ca click on the hamburger(top left corner), careers, required record checks, Alberta Residents: How to Apply, Intervention Record Check Form. This form can be emailed to High Level Children's Services at the email provided at the end of the form. Email the form back with a scanned copy of government issued photo ID (either a drivers license, or passport).

No School - Monday, September 30 National Day for Truth & Reconciliation

The Canadian government designated **Monday**, **September 30** National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, beginning in 2021. This responds to Truth and Reconciliation Call to Action 80, which states that the federal government will work with Indigenous people to establish a statutory day to "honour Survivors, their families, and communities, and ensure that public commemoration of the history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process".

Students can wear orange on Friday, September 27 to commemorate this day.

Update Nut Safe School Policy

We are committed to providing all students a safe environment in which to learn. We consistently have some students attending Sandhills who have allergies. Some allergic reactions can be more serious than others. Peanut/Tree nut allergies can cause serious allergic reactions and we wish to prevent this from happening. We ask that parents do not send food items to school that contain peanuts or nuts of any kind (this includes peanut **butter**). This is especially important if you are donating a snack to a class for a celebration. Students can bring Nutella sandwiches for their own lunch. Every student's safety is of our utmost concern and we ask for your assistance in keeping students safe. Thank you for your assistance in this important matter.

Student Profiles

Thank you to those parents who have already updated their child's information in MyFVSD. In previous years your child would have brought home a student demographic form for you to fill out with any changes to your child's information. For the 2024-2025 school year the Fort Vermilion School Division (FVSD) is providing an online re-enrollment form where parents and guardians can review their child's information and sign the form. The online re-enrollment form is for students who attended an FVSD school last year and will be attending an FVSD school in the 2024-2025 school year.

You can sign in to MyFVSD at **my.fvsd.ab.ca** to view students you are associated with and review their student profile.

There are two ways you can sign into MyFVSD:

- 1. Using a Google (@gmail.com) or Microsoft (@outlook.com) email account that is attached to your contact at school.
- 2. Through text messaging which will require you to enter the Alberta Student Number (ASN) for one of the students you are associated with. A student's ASN can be found at the top of their report card.
