Staffing Update



- 2. Approval of Agenda
- 3. M/S Mike/Ryan that agenda was approved. Carried
- 4. Minutes from previous meeting November 25, 2024, were read by Maria Wieler.
- 5. Approval of previous minutes M/S Mike/Ryan that the November 4, 2024, minutes be accepted as presented. Carried
- 6. *Chairperson's Report*. Ryan Knelsen provided a report from a FVSD Chairperson/Trustee meeting with the Superintendent that he attended, positive results were shared on how the FVSD was doing, also positive feedback was shared regarding the results of BHPS. Thanks to all our dedicated staff.

7. Principal's Report

- Thank you to Tim and Lorraine Bueckert, Susan Wolfe, and Jennifer Martens for providing a hot meal for all our staff, it is appreciated by all.
- <u>Update on Caleb Teichroeb</u>: As reported from the Teichroeb Family, they have some great news, if everything goes as planned they are hoping to be back home in 3 weeks.
- There has been positive feedback from parents on the Christmas Concert, thanks to all the staff that put in all the effort to make it a great Christmas Concert.
- <u>Staffing Update:</u>
 - Shakira Giesbrecht has been in the school working as an EA since Dec 10th, it has been really good to have her join the BHPS staff.
 - Mrs. Keefe is out of her classroom for a while and Mrs. Schellenberg has been covering for her which is working very well.
 - Mrs. Raelene Peters will go on a maternity leave starting Feb 11th, we are still in the process of finding a qualified teacher to fill her position while she is gone.
- Social Media/Alcohol/Drugs presentation Update:
 - There was a social media safety presentation in the junior high classroom on January 16th by the FVSD Connection Team.
 - We are waiting to find a qualified person through AB Health Services to do a presentation on Drugs/Alcohol/Vaping.
 - A few council members are willing to sit in the Junior High classes to observe while these presentations are being done.
- New Programs:
 - A program called 'Let It Grow' is something we are thinking of bringing into our school, it is a program that helps students develop more confidence and independence. It was previewed at the school council meeting and the school council thought it was a good program.
 - A program called 'Polar Club' is starting now which will give students opportunity to go outside on "indoor recess" days when the temperature is between -20 to -35 degrees Celsius. In order to participate in Polar Club, students will need to have a permission form signed by parents and have all mandatory warm weather clothing which will be checked by staff before proceeding outside.

- Teacher Recruitment: There were a few changes made to the recruitment program by Mr. Mike McMann. All FVSD staff were provided with the opportunity to participate in recruitment fairs, they had one group going in January already which had a great turnout.
- Mr. John Acreman, Mrs. Melissa McDonald, and Mrs. Shannon Peters delivered the annual board presentation to the trustees of FVSD, positive feedback was received in regards to the board presentation.
- The Blue Mountain Ski hill is now ready for students, the Junior High might get a chance to go there in the near future, a small payment will be required for participating students which will be confirmed at a later date.
- The school currently has Z-Space computers which helps the students increase their learning experience by having the ability to work with 3D technology. The school council got an opportunity to engage with the computers to see their capabilities. The council members found this to be an interesting opportunity.
- Susan Siemens was in the school to deliver presentations regarding Mennonite history and will be available for presentations for the younger grades in March. There was good feedback from staff about the presentations.
- 8. Financial update:
 - Budget review: 39% of the budget is spent as of December 31/24, 41% was spent on December 31/23. We are on track and in line of previous years spending.
